# Year One Overview: The Starting Point



- We have worked closely with the EYFS team to understand exactly where the children are and where the curriculum finished to identify gaps within the children's learning.
- There has been a very detailed handover between old and new teachers and we very aware of the children's needs.
- Our environments have been adapted to reflect the children's needs and interests and to replicate the EYFS environments on a smaller scale.

## The First Few Weeks



- We will be finding out what the children already know and can do-baseline assessment.
- We will use this information to help us develop our curriculum, targeted to each child's needs.
- We would value any contributions you would like to make in helping us get to know your child's needs.
- You will be invited to discuss your child's progress & adjustment to school within the first term during Parents Evening.
- The children will be spending their time getting to know their new class teacher and their new routines- this can take some time as there are new classrooms to explore, new toilets (which they can access at any time) and lunchtime routines.

# The Curriculum

Within the EYFS, the children's curriculum was taught against the Early Learning Goals.

In Year One, the children will be taught these subjects which will include cross-curricular approaches:

Phonics, English, Maths, Science, PE
History, Geography, RE, Computing, Art, DT, PSHE.

Our Topic for this term is 'Up, Up and Away' 🔶

Play and Learn time is still integral to the children's learning and we will be continuing this on a daily basis. During this time the children will have access to resources and activities that support their Topic learning.

# Curriculum Maps



### English

Fiction: Our first rich text of the year will be 'Puffin Peter' by Petr Horácek. We will be focusing on our spoken language skills by using role play and recounting events in chronological order.

We will build upon our learning of sentence structure and punctuation from reception and think about writing our

Non-Fiction: Using the text "Gruffalo Crumble and Other Recipes' by Julia Donaldson, we will look at writing instructions and making our very own imaginative recipe!

Phonics: We will continue using Monster Phonics help us

to segment and blend words when we are reading. We will continue to focus on reading our high frequency words to help us with our fluency.



### Understanding the World



History and Geography: We be finding out all about the life and achievements of Amelia Earhart and looking at some of the route she took whilst exploring the world.

RE: We will be thinking about the similarities and differences between ourselves and others, and among families, communities and traditions.

### Maths

Number: We will be focusing on our numbers to 10; patterns, counting, comparison, estimating and ordering; addition and subtraction; solving problems.

Geometry: We will be looking at position and direction, building upon our language skills too. We will learn about turns and how to make these.

### Understanding Arts and Culture

Art: We will be experimenting with colour mixing and a range of different media to create wonderful pieces of artwork, inspired by Gil Haller's Hot Air Balloon Paintings. We will safely use different techniques and tools to express our own ideas and feelings.



Music: We will listen with concentration to a range of music genres. We will learn how to sing songs and experiment with ways we can change music.

# Afternoon Learning in Year One







During Play and Learn time, children will now be set challenges to complete. These are activities that children can access and complete independently, or with the support of an adult. This gives the children more opportunities to take ownership of their learning and work on their independence.

All of the children's challenge learning can be found in their Topic books.

### Our Books



- Children will no longer have learning journals like they did in Reception.
- They will record their work in various books related to the subject that is being taught.
- The books that your child will have are as follows:
  - -English
  - -Maths
  - -Topic
  - -Monster Phonics
  - -Handwriting
- -Within these books we will also record elements of child initiated learning that we have observed in our play and learn sessions.
- -We follow the school marking policy that can be viewed on the school website.

## Our Phonics Scheme



- We are continuing to use the 'Monster Phonics' scheme for our phonics teaching.
- This scheme is in line with 'Letters & Sounds' and is a highly engaging program with a multisensory approach towards teaching phonics.
- The children will be building on what they have already learnt as part of the scheme in Reception.





## Our Environments



Each classroom is set up in a similar way to Reception to support

the children's transition.

### Each classroom has:

- Creative Area
- Maths Area
- Role Play Area
- Writing Area
- Reading Area
- Outdoor Area
- Small World Area
- Investigation Area



















The children don't have access to each others classrooms like they did in Reception.

However, each classroom has the same areas and resources to cover an extensive curriculum.



# Learning at home



### Reading

- -Children need to bring in reading books and records every day.
- -We ask that you make a note in the reading record once your child has read their book, so that we can change it.

### Spellings

- -Children will receive a Monster Phonics spelling book after half term.
- -A list of spellings will be sent out on Marvellous Me each week.
- -A spelling test will take place on a Monday.

### Other Homework

- -At the moment, whilst children are settling, we have not set any homework.
- -When we do, it will be on Education City and a message will be sent out on Marvellous Me.



# Uniform



### Daily Uniform Expectations

- -Grey trousers/dress/skirt

### PE Kit

- -Blue logo PE top

### Outside Trainers
