1947 – Princess Elizabeth dedicates herself to the nation

1927: Princess Elizabeth, one. She was third in line to the throne behind her father, the Duke of York, and Edward, Prince of Wales.





1936: Elizabeth was fond of her parents' corgis from a young age. She received her first corgi, Susan, as an 18th birthday present and has owned more than 30 since she became Queen.

1937: King George VI ascended the throne after his brother, Edward VIII, abdicated. This made Princess Elizabeth the heir to the throne – something she had never expected as a child.





She lived through the Second World War and remained at Windsor Castle instead of moving abroad. She kept the country positive with radio messages she broadcast with her sister - Margaret. She was only 14 when she first gave a radio message.



1947: Princess Elizabeth marries Philip Mountbatten at Westminster Abbey. He becomes the Duke of Edinburgh.



1953 - Service to the nation begins as Elizabeth is crowned Queen in Westminster Abbey.

1966: the England captain Bobby Moore holds the World Cup, collected from the Queen, after leading his team to a 4-2 victory over West Germany at Wembley stadium in London.





1977: Queen Elizabeth II poses for a silver jubilee portrait in the throne room of Buckingham Palace. More than a million people line the streets of London in celebration, and a chain of beacons is lit across the country.

2022: The Queen celebrated her Platinum Jubilee - 70 years on the throne!





The Queen had 4 children, 8 grandchildren and 12 greatgrandchildren. The Queen made her first Christmas Day speech in 1952. She made 69 Christmas Day messages in her lifetimes and has sent over 50,000 Christmas cards to family, friends and politicians across the world.





The Queen knighted hundreds of people and gave thousands of medals to ordinary members of the public. Here she is knighting Sir **Captain Tom Moore** in 2020.
