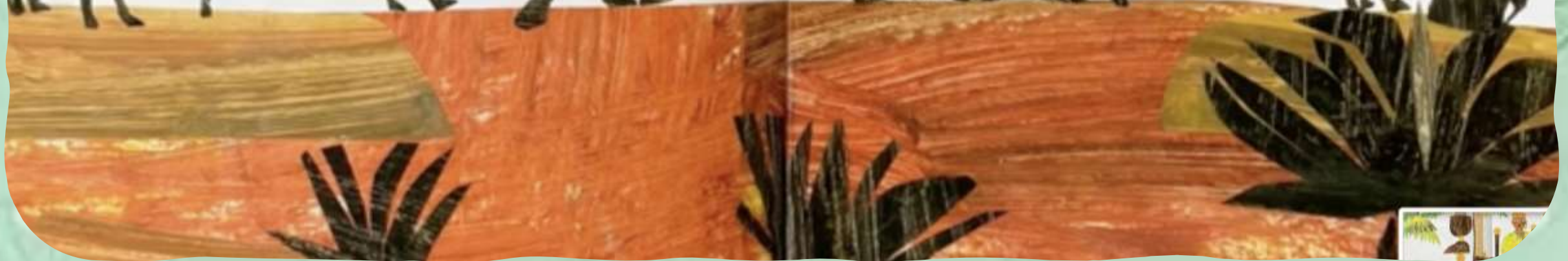




Once upon a time,

gate, and the old king went to open it.





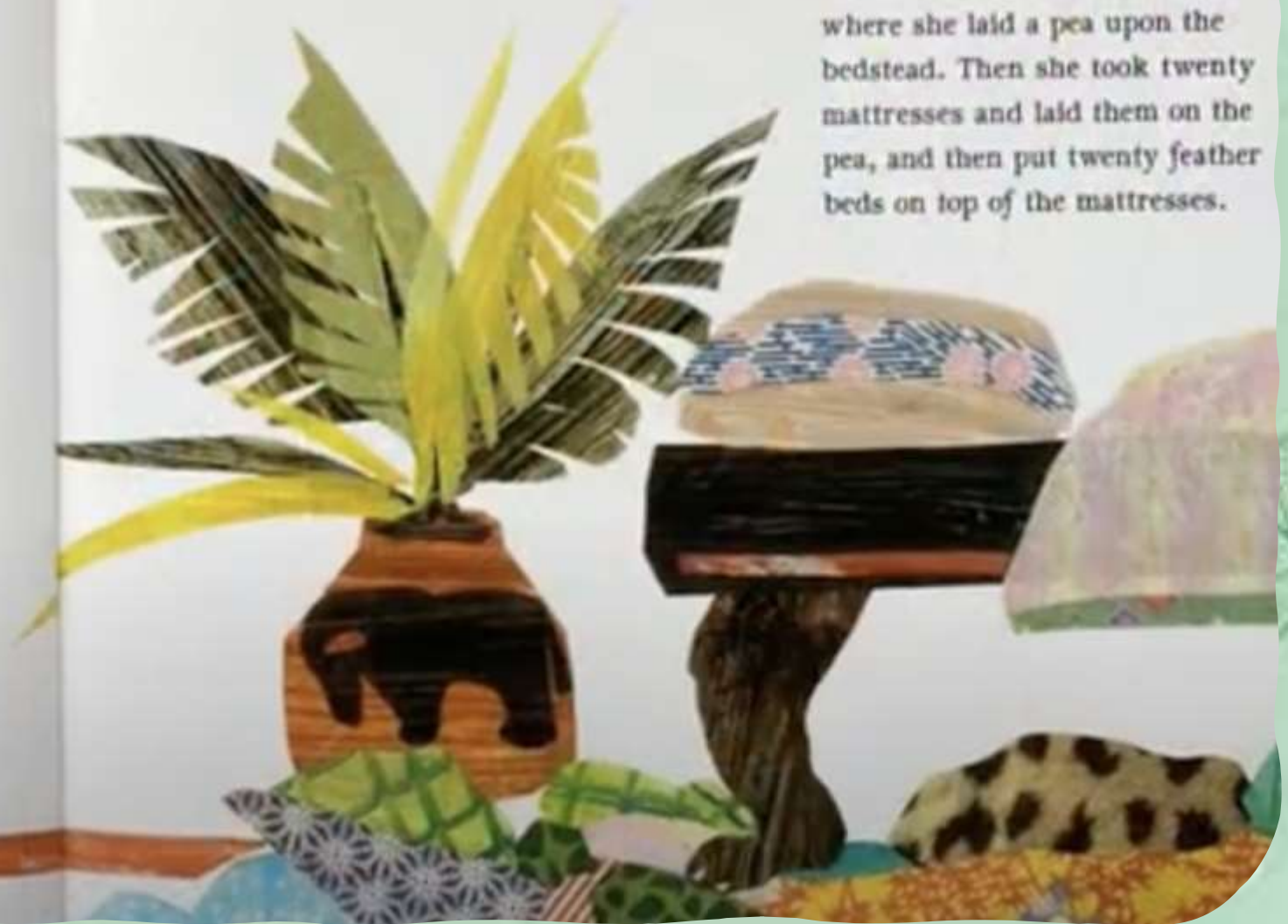
There was a princess

The pea was put in a museum, where it may still be seen, if no one has stolen it.



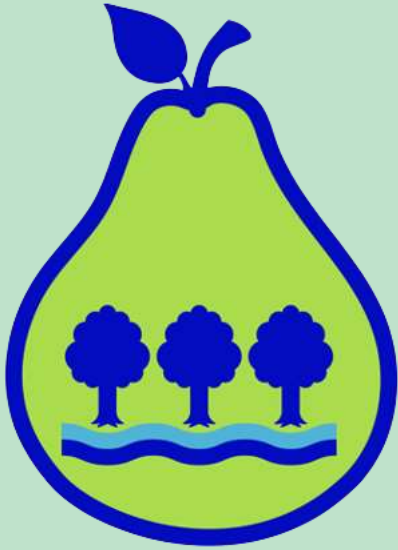
