English



Fiction: Our first rich text of the year will be 'Lost & Found' by

Oliver Jeffers. This book will take us on journey through the South Pole to help a little boy return a lost penguin.

We will be focusing on our spoken language

skills by using role play and recounting events. We will then be focusing on using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops to record our ideas.

Our next text will be 'Katie in London' by James Mayhew which we will use to focus on

writing a non chronological report.



Phonics: We will continue using Monster Phonics to help us to segment and blend words when we are reading. We will continue to focus on reading our high frequency words to help us with our fluency.

Understanding the World

History and Geography: We be finding out about the life and achievements of inspirational figures, including Amelia Earhart, Neil Armstrong and Matthew Henson.

RE: We will be thinking about the similarities and differences between ourselves and others, and among families, communities and traditions. We will be focusing on how Christians celebrate Harvest and different Harvest festivals around the world.

Maths

Number: We will be focusing on place value skills this half term; looking at patterns; sorting, counting, comparison and ordering. We will feuring our addition and subtraction knowledge to minutes bonds and part whole models. will be looking at recognising, sorting and Geometry: \ naming 2D and 3D shapes before learning about their

Understanding our Health and Well-Being

PE: We will be focusing on our coordination and control in gymnastics, looking at how we move in our spaces and handling equipment safely.

PSHE: As part of settling in to Year One, we will be taking part in daily well-being sessions which will focus on our mental well-being and understanding choices and consequences.



Science:. Our first focus will be on the human body. Looking at features of our bodies and exploring our senses.

We will also look at the seasonal changes during Autumn, looking at the variation in the length of days and the changes we observe.

We will be exploring the use of everyday materials, looking at their absorbency, floating and sinking and melting and freezing.

DT: We are going to focus on our 'Builder Project' by selecting and using construction materials to build a structure of a landscape in London. We will explore a range of material linked to Science identify which would be the best for our models.

Computing: We will be completing a 'Beebot Project' to navigate them towards a target using simple algorithms. We will use world maps to take a trip around the world and visit key areas.
