We will exploring 'Winters Child' this half term and learning all about fables. We will look at different features of this book including characters, setting and dialogue. We will then create a fantasy story based on a fable.

We will then be reading ''Ice Palace' sequencing the story and summarising key events in the story. We will identify how language, structure and presentation contribute to meaning.





Spellings: We will continue to consolidate our phonics knowledge using Monster phonics. We will address any gaps in learning and assess their understanding of High Frequency words too. We will continue to work on Year 3 superhero spellings.

Understanding the World

Geography: We will continue to explore our woodland area in our school grounds, mapping out habitats and detailing any environmental issues. We will then compare this to the rainforest habitats we have been learning about.

History: We will briefly learn how WW1 and WW2 impacted families in Britain and why poppies are significant symbols of remembrance. We will read stories and poems about remembrance before creating our class wreath and poppy artwork.

RE: We will be exploring Diwali, Hanukah and Christmas. As we move closer to Christmas, we will look at how Christmas is celebrated around the world and the significance of light within these festivals.

Spanish: We will continue to learn colours and numbers before how to say a range of animals in Spanish.

Understanding Arts and Culture

Art: We will create poppy art using a range of new techniques and mediums such as acrylic paint, chalk and tissue paper.

Music: We will continue to explore differences in dynamics, pitch and tempo while using our Music Express topics in Music. Savannah will continue to learn the violin.

Maths

Number: We will continue to work hard to secure our understanding of 3 digit numbers, especially when adding and subtracting. We will then move on to finding compliments to 100, estimating amounts and using inverse operations to check our answers.

We will also have a greater focus on learning our timetables, finding patterns that might help us and working really hard on our recall using TTRockstars.

Fluency: During fluency sessions, we will address any gaps in that still remain whilst also overlearning or deepening the children's understanding of key concepts. These sessions will be quick games and lots of fun for everyone but are vital for the children's learning and retention of important areas of mathematics.

Understanding our Health and Well-Being

PE: We will begin to learn balances and how to use equipment in our gymnastics lessons.

PSHCE: We will be learning about 'celebrating differences' as well as our weekly assembly topics.

Understanding Science and Technology

Science: Our new Science topic this term is nutrition. We will learn about the food groups, what we need to stay health through the healthy eating food plate. We hen be looking at how to reduce food waste.

DT: We will be set a specific design brief for our tasty autumn treats that we will work hard to fulfil. We will research recipes using search engines, design our treats and use our cookery skills to create our tasty creations before evaluating them.

Computing: we will continue to learn about network, how they work and how to responsibly share documents and information.
