
English

We will start the term looking at a the book called 'Tidy' by Emily Gravett. We will be learning to write about real events and write

for a range of different purposes. Over the summer, we will begin learning about rereading our work and making simple edits to make improvements.





Spelling: We will continue to follow the Monster Phonics spelling scheme of work for Year 2. We will revise the sounds we have learnt previously to ensure these are secure but focus on spelling rules.

Understanding the World

Geography: In Geography this half term we will be focusing on maps and how to read them. We will talk about birds eye view before moving on to reading maps of familiar setting and having a go at making our own.

RE: We will be looking at the idea of human responsibility and values within communities. We will make links to charity and think about ways we can help others.

Maths

In Maths this half term we will be continuing our work on multiplication and division, but also developing this knowledge into fractions. We will be finding halves and quarters of numbers and shapes.

We will then move on to telling the time. We will mostly focus on analogue clocks, telling the o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to times. As part of this we will also look at duration and estimating time.



Every Maths lesson includes a fluency session which supports the children with their mental recall and calculation, including counting.

Understanding our Health and Well-Being

PE: In PE we will be continuing to develop our bat and ball skills and beginning to apply these as we learn about cricket.

PSHE: Our topic in PSHE is called Relationships. We will be learning about how families can be similar and different. We will be looking at what makes positive friendships and how to solve conflict as well as trusting relationships and keeping secrets.

Understanding Arts and Culture

Art: In Art we will be completing a drawing project. We will look at developing a wide range of art and design techniques, using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space. We will focus on our fine motor skills and take inspiration from The Starry Night.



Understanding Science and Technology

Science: In Science we will be continuing to learn about plants before moving on to living things and life cycles. We will learn about lots of different life cycles including our own. We will finish the topic by comparing similarities and differences between the different life cycles.
