

English

To begin this half term, we will be starting a new book called 'Beegu' by Alexis Deacon. We will use this text fictional text to help us with our narrative writing.

The second text we will be exploring is 'The Friendly Mammoth' also written by Anna Terreros-Martin. We will use this text to encourage children to link what they read to their own experiences and discuss the significance of the title and events within the story.





Phonics: We will continue using Monster Phonics to help us to segment and blend words when we are reading. We will continue to focus on reading our high frequency words to help us with our fluency. We will be preparing for our Phonics Screening check.

Understanding Arts and Culture

Art: The children will be developing their understanding of how to create light and dark tones using pencils. We will be looking at how shading can create texture to apply tone to shape.

DT: To understand the purpose of a wheel and axel and creating their our own explorers vehicle.

Maths

Place Value: This half term we will continue our place value work, securing our knowledge of numbers up to 20. We will be looking at our number bonds to 20, doubles and other related facts. This knowledge will then help us to solve a range of number problems.

Addition and Subtraction: Once we have completed our place value work, we will be using this knowledge in our addition and subtraction to 20.

Measuring

We will be looking at various ways to measure length and height using standard



PE: In PE this term, this focus will be on ball skills when playing in a game. We will look at invasions and defending techniques and how to keep score. We will also be developing our skills to hold and use a racket and Mrs Williams will be supporting us with our Gymnastics.

PSHE: In PSHE, we will looking at healthy eating and looking at ways to keep ourselves safe; crossing the road, mental health, keeping clean and what to do when we are feeling poorly.

Understanding the World

RE: This term in RE we will be focusing on how people celebrate Easter. We are also planning to visit a local church to identify how Christians take part in 'naming ceremonies' and comparing these to other religions.

History: We will be focusing on the concept of 'past and present' to identify and compare old and new aspects of our local town. We will also be looking at how peoples lives have changed over time and learn how to communicate our findings.

Understanding Science and Technology

Science: This term we will be focusing on the world around us and why it is important to care for our planet. We will be looking at recycling and growing new plants and focusing on the changes that we will observe in the Spring season. We will also finish our animal topic looking at carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.

Computing: We will build upon our knowledge of how to use a computer and start to create our own pieces of digital art. We will be working on our touchpad
