A warm welcome to Peartree Spring Primary School. We are so proud of how well the children have settled into school! They have had a brilliant start to the term. We thank you for your patience as we release the children at the end of the day. This half term, we are asking the children to think about themselves, their feelings and their world. We will be celebrating our lives with our friends in our class and our successful first few weeks at school together in our new school.

Reading: The children will receive a picture book in the next few days. The children are asked to discuss the picture book and tell the story out loud. The children will then move on to using their phonic knowledge to sound out simple words. Reading should be recorded daily and we ask you to sign the reading record every time you hear them read. We use the reading record to monitor reading at school, so please make sure that it is in the school bag every morning. The children will change their reading book daily, once they have read at home.

Homework & WOW Moments: You will all be given a login detail for 'Evidence Me'. On this platform we will share with you achievements from your child's learning. We would ask you to have with your children at home to support their learning within school. The opportunity to 'talk' through a topic with an adult at home will develop the children's confidence, build up their vocabulary and understanding around a topic. You also have an opportunity to upload any work or WOW moments from home. For example, learning to swim, practising mark making or riding a bike. Please include photos where possible to aid your child when they are sharing their news with their peers.

PE Kits: Children will need PE kits in school every day and outdoor shoes for playtimes. Please note that your child will have the opportunity to explore the outside environment on a daily basis no matter the weather. We ask that children bring a coat into school each day and that their footwear is suitable for all weathers and that you **do not provide them with black plimsolls** as the material is too thin. Children can bring wellies to use in the garden if they wish. Please ensure long hair is tied back and earrings are removed or covered.
