

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:



This half term we will be continuing to look at how to look after ourselves, with a focus on how to keep ourselves safe. We will be thinking about personal risk management and thinking about how our actions can keep us safe.

Independence

We will be continuing to build independence and resilience when working and playing. Looking at resolving conflicts with peers independently and the importance of following rules. We will also be looking at how to respect others views and opinions.

Physical Education:

We will continue our daily Busy Fingers session which focus on our fine motor activities to build upon and strengthen muscle development. We also have opportunities for gross motor skills in our garden that change weekly.



PE Sessions:

This half term we will be continue to work on our gross motor skills, with a focus on ball skills. We will look at kicking, throwing, catching and passing skills using a ball or bean bag.

Communication and Language:



We will be continuing to use Big Talk to develop our speaking skills, and the class mascots will be coming home to one child each week, for them to then talk about and share.

We will be using talk daily in order to - discuss changes in our environment, retell known stories, focus on language skills and sentence structure and look at British Values and what they mean to us.

We will be learning to explain our ideas in more detail this term and link more than one thing together in a sentence.

Understanding the World:



This half term we are celebrating 'Earth Day' and will look at ways we can help the planet. Other celebrations / festivals that we will explore include: St George's Day, International Space Day.

We will be comparing our environment with others around the world. Looking at our lives and cultures as well as animals around the world. As the seasons change we will be looking at the impacts on our environment and learning how to plant and grow our own flowers.

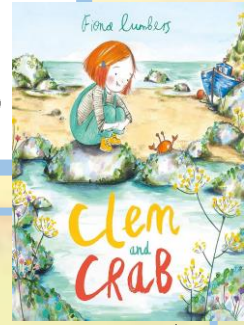


Foundation Stage Curriculum Map Summer Term 1 2026

Literacy:

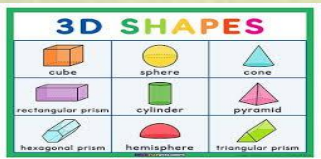


We will be continuing to follow the Monster Phonics programme and focusing on segmenting and blending a selection of CVCC, CCVC and CCVCC words.



Our Pathways Literacy text this half term will be Clem and the Crab by Fiona Lumbers. We will use this text to expand our vocabulary about environments and looking after our planet. We will be using descriptive language to create our own sentences as well as creating our own posters encouraging people to recycle and keep the beaches tidy.

Maths:



We will be continuing to use our White Rose scheme in Maths this half term. Our focus will be on numbers beyond 20. This will include building numbers beyond 20, as well as a focus on orally counting and finding patterns. Children will continue to deepen their understanding on odd and even numbers. We will also be learning about 2D and 3D shapes and where these are in the world around us.

Expressive Arts and Design:



We will be creating with a variety of different materials, exploring different textures. We will be using different recycled materials, picking materials for a purpose and begin to articulate our choices. We will also be designing and making our own papier-mâché alien planets.

We will be manipulating clay to make our own shells, exploring and creating different patterns. Focusing on the design and making process. In Music we will be giving our opinion on various pieces of music. We are exposed to different artists and genres weekly. We will be singing and performing familiar songs as part of a group.
