

## Communication and Language:

We will be continuing to use Big Talk to develop our speaking skills, and the Class Mascot will be coming home to one child each week, for them to fill with things they'd like to share. We will practise articulating our ideas clearly, expanding our vocabulary and using joining words such as 'because,' 'then,' and 'and.'

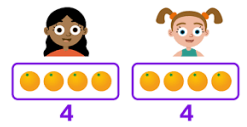
We will be learning to explain our ideas in more detail this term and link more than one thing together in a sentence.



## Understanding the World:

This half term we will be looking at different maps and how we can represent our class environment. We will be looking at how different cultures have variations of traditional fairy tales and take part in our annual Fairytale Ball. We are also going on our school trip to Gulliver's where we will be looking at dinosaurs. We will be thinking about the past and how the environment were different to our own.

Towards the end of the term we will be looking at the topic of 'People who help us' and link this to our goals and aspirations of what we want to be when we are older.



## Maths:

As we continue with our White Rose scheme this half term, we will be focusing on consolidating all the learning from this year so far.

We will be working on our mental recall of number bonds as well as exploring and gaining a deeper understanding of connections between numbers. This will include looking at sharing, grouping, subtraction odds and even etc. We will also be visualising, mapping and building repeating patterns.

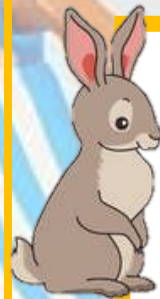
## Physical Education:

We will be getting ready for Sports Day this half term! We are excited to work in our House Teams which are different colours that will be shared with you. ## Literacy:

We will be continuing to follow the Monster Phonics programme and focusing on segmenting and blending a selection of CVCC, CCVC and CCVCC words.

Our Pathways Literacy text this half term will be 'Supertato' by Sue Hendra and Paul Linnet. We will use this text to expand our knowledge of fictional stories, looking at how each story has a twist and focusing on resolutions. We will be using our acting skills to perform the story before writing our own versions.

## Personal, Social and Emotional

### Development:

Welcome to Year 1



This half term we are focusing on celebrating all of our achievements this year and will be sharing their online Learning Book to reflect on the year. Our focus is on taking pride in our accomplishments.

We will also be looking forward at our goals and aspirations. There will be lots of transition work preparing for Year 1 towards the end of the term, with the children able to spend time with their new teacher in their new classroom, further information will follow.



## Expressive Arts and Design:

For our fairy tale ball we will be dancing to music. We will explore different music and choreograph routine, linking movements. We will practise performing our dances to each other.

We will be looking at different traditional fairy tales and retelling some of these familiar stories. We will be using storylines in our play and performances.

We will also be learning about dinosaurs. We will be creating our own sculptures and add texture to our designs.

We will be learning how to make our own comic books linked to our literacy text, Supertato and creating different prints using potatoes.
